his is an introductory course designed to provide students with the basic concepts of probability and atistics, geared towards their use in psychological research. The course will include an overview of most of e common topics in this area, including: descriptive statistics (graphing data, measures of central ndency, measures of variability); probability (independent events, conditional probability, normal stribution, Central Limit Theorem); and statistical inference (sampling distribution, hypothesis tests,

statistical significance, p values, confidence intervals, t-tests, one-way ANOVA, Chi-square and Pearson's r).

Final grade components

20% - 6 homework assignments (5 best scores count towards the final grade) 80% - final assignment (Multiple choice test – in-class exam)
